IMPORTANT

READ CAREFULLY

The Division of Motor Vehicles is making every effort possible to protect you from automobile accidents.

Read this pamphlet carefully and co-operate with this Division by having your automobile inspected "Free of Charge" at the Official Adjusting Station in your locality.

AFTER HAVING SECURED YOUR 1931 LICENSE PLATES, THEY SHOULD BE SECURELY FASTENED TO THE MACHINE IN SUCH PLACE AS TO BE IN PLAIN VIEW AT ALL TIMES (AS BELOW).

DETAILS OF INSPECTION

The FREE INSPECTION shall consist of the following, ONLY:

1. TEST BRAKES.

Requirements (Driving at 30 Mi. Per Hr.): All motor vehicles except commercial trucks, and tractors exceeding 7,000 pounds gross weight:

	Good	Perfect	Legal
2 wheel	40 ft.	30 ft.	50 ft.
4 wheel	30 ft.	20 ft.	50 ft.
Hand Brakes	60 ft.	40 ft.	75 ft.

Commercial motor vehicles, trucks and tractors with semi-trailers attached exceeding 7,000 pounds gross weight:

Both hand and service applied simultaneously	50 ft.	Either applied separately	75 ft.
--	--------	---------------------------	--------

(All tests on hard level surface.)

2. TEST HORN.

Requirements: Press button and determine whether signal gives sufficient warning.

3. TEST LIGHTS.

Requirements: (a) Virginia State law limits to 32 candle power bulbs in headlights. Bulbs showing signs of blackening or a whitish discoloration inside of the glass are inefficient and should be discarded. They no longer give the proper candle power.

(b) All bulbs which are burned out or missing must be replaced.

(c) Lights must have proper lens and reflectors must be bright.

(d) All tail lamps must have a RED lens.

4. TEST STEERING MECHANISM.

Requirements: Wearing parts must appear to be sufficiently strong so as not to indicate any possibility of breaking under ordinary conditions, thus causing an accident.

5. MIRRORS.

Requirements: Virginia State law requires all vehicles so constructed or loaded as to prevent rear view of highway to be equipped with a mirror in such condition and so placed as to give rear visibility.

6. WINDSHIELD WIPERS.

Requirements: Test to see if windshield wiper is workable.

7. OBSCURE TAGS.

Requirements: Tags must be wholly visible and not obscured by bumpers, tires or other accessories.

The time required for the above inspection (no repairs or adjustments included) should be about ten minutes. Repairs and adjustment, if any be necessary, may be made by agreement with owner and station at usual rates.




W-S Region Meeting January 17, 2016

My First Car

The first car that I could call my own was a 1957 Studebaker Provincial Station Wagon. The car was arctic white with a chrome luggage rack. My father bought the car new at Cochran Studebaker in Champaign, Illinois. The car also had a rear facing third seat. Even though my father would not let us have our own car while my older brother and I were in high school. (he was concerned that our grades would suffer) we had access to the Studebaker which was the family car. My father taught extension classes at the University of Illinois so he had a university car to drive. This gave us more opportunity to drive the Studebaker. During my junior year at Bridgewater College, he allowed me to buy the car and bring it back to Virginia. The Studebaker was nicknamed "The White Flash" and made many trips to Harrisonburg and Doc's Tea Room (where the Madison College girls were).

By the time I graduated in 1964, the old Studebaker was showing signs of age (and additional repair needs). Since I was then about to start teaching at Elkton, I drove down to Hensley Chevrolet and purchased a brand new tan colored Corvair Monza. Every time we have a class reunion at Bridgewater, my classmates recall the "White Flash" and how we would all contribute to the 30 cents per gallon gasoline to make our frequent trips to "The Burg".




