






The oldest car at the show was the 1906 Wayne owned by Jeff Brown, son of the founder of our W-S Region John Brown

It was finally time to install the fenders that had been finished back in 2011.





Fender welting is Installed between the fenders and radiator surround.



Once the front bumper is in place it starts to look like a real car.

Rear bumper in place after Jim Gregory helpd me reshape the support brackets to fit.





I decided that the wheels, originally finished in 1982, were showing some chips and needed to be repainted. Masking the tires was the toughest part of this job.



The fenders are then bolted in place while being careful to prevent paint damage.



The car takes shape after the front fenders are in place.

The rear mounted spare bolts to a bracket tucked inside the rear bumper.



The headlights are mounted on tie bars beteen the fender and radiator surround.





Adding the locking hubcap gives the rear of the car the finished look.
