Greetings, Waynesboro—Staunton Region Members & Friends,



Restoration of a 1934 Chevrolet Master By Stu Allen

Part 15 - Time to Install Upholstery



Since no reproduction floor mats were available, I found some ribbed rubber material with a similar pattern and using the original remnants as a template, cut a new mat and installed it over the wooden floor.




I brought the front seats back from the upholstery shop so that I could drive the car to the shop for installation of the remaining rear seat, etc.

The car came back from the shop with the rear seat, side panels, arm rests, headliner, door panels and kick panels completed, ready for the final interior trim.





I then installed the window garnish moldings, door handles and window cranks. Next came installation of the rear carpet that extends under the front bucket seats. The metal plates protect the carpet when the driver seat slides back and forth when adjusted.



Installation of the repro sill plates provided a finished edge protecting the carpet.



The dome light switch was installed along with the repro assist strap. The strap helps rear seat passengers exit through the front door once the passenger seat is tilted forward.

I then installed the sun visor after carefully locating the hardware mounting hole locations. It was nerve wracking poking holes in the brand new headliner.





The repro rear window shade was installed completing the interior.


