As a follow-up to our May issue where we discussed long-life coolant, I received a note and article from John Sayler, Editor of the <u>Gas Buggy Gazette</u>, newsletter for the Gettysburg Region, AACA. John writes:

"This summer we interviewed Jay Leno for his insights on antique car maintenance and storage. Your readers might appreciate knowing about this product. Attached is an excerpt from our 5-page article:"

A coolant good for 15 years!

Gas Buggy Gazette: You were mentioning the other day [during planning for the interview] that you use a permanent anti-freeze—

Jay Leno: I use [a product] called [Evans]. I take really good care of my Duesenbergs, I've got a few of those, and one day, one I've had for 14 yearsand because they didn't have catch pans in them, they tend to overflow, or if I drive them hard-I would add a little bit of water every now and then, and I really wasn't measuring my anti-freeze properly. I was just kind of adding some water to it. And one day, I was working on the car, and I pushed my finger against one of the water plates-one of the water jackets-and my finger literally went right through. I took the plate off, and I was pulling out handfuls of rust from where the water had eaten through the plates. Well, I quickly learned my lesson there. I took the plates off; we had some new plates made. We drained the engine completely. And I've been using stuff called Evans Waterless Coolant.



They use it in diesel locomotives and things of this nature. I've had some cars—it's been in a couple of Bugattis for 15 years—and it's as clean as the day it went in.

It uses no water at all, it doesn't boil until 375 degrees, so consequently you're not going to boil over. Some people have a fear that, with babbit bearings, the engine might get hot and you don't even realize it; but you still have a temperature gauge. So if it [the temperature] goes to 250, pull over, stop, or do something else before it damages—

But there will be no corrosion, you won't have to replace water pumps. I've got a Packard V-12 and the water had literally eaten through the jacket, and I had to repair that as well.

The nice thing is you don't get that corrosion around the clamps, where your rubber clamps connect to your metal pieces, where it sometimes turns green—as the air hits the water and it interacts—so everything stays nice and clean...


