The Questionnaire is your opportunity to speak out, to tell your elected officers what want W-S to be. Please don't be bashful or overlook the response, send it or give it to me or another officer. The most important conclusion from the responses to date is that you would like more day driving tours- about 50-60 miles. Supplying these is not difficult - if we have tour leaders. What is required of a tour leader is to run the route a week or two before the tour date to insure the directions are still correct. If not we'll help you make changes. 
