
Part 7 Moving Right Along.....

Moving is always a challenging experience, especially if you've been in one location for 12+ years. My 3-car garage in Michigan was stuffed with the four antique cars (including Betsy who was still in the body-off condition) and my basement workshop with all the woodworking equipment had grown significantly during our time there. We had spent much of 2001 and early 2002 trying to find the ideal location in the Valley with a house that met family requirements and room to build a suitable garage/ shop. We finally located our new home near Staunton, purchased it and then put our Michigan home on the market. The next ten months were a challenge trying to keep two houses going (660 miles between houses) so needless to say, little car work got done. We finally moved our furniture in November 2002 and got settled in on Stayman Lane near Staunton.

Work started on the new garage/shop in January 2003.



Next came wiring, plumbing, insulation and drywall. We painted the interior in November and had the hoist installed in May 2004.



I finally got Betsy and the other cars moved into the new garage in July 2004.


