Report of Responses to Waynesboro-Staunton Membership Questionnaire September 16, 2016

1) SUMMARY

We had a good response to the Questionnaire approximately 33% of them were returned (survey returns are usually on the order of 20-25%) with high indication of satisfaction with what we're doing and many good suggestions for what could be done to enhance or change our activities. Specifically 21 responded they were satisfied and 1 responded not satisfied. The responses dealing with attendance indicated the primary reason for not attending was conflicts- family, other commitments, etc. Not dissatisfaction with the club.

The suggestions for additions or change for improvement against which I think we may be able to take action relatively easily are:

- + More day tours, 50 to 60 miles,
- + Overnite tours,
- + Visits to members garages or restorations in progress,
- + Pair new members with a "coach" to get them feeling at home,

+ Invite new members that may not have cars to ride with a member,

+ Shorten business portion of meeting, start meeting while meal is being served,

+ More covered dish meetings.

Other suggestions which may be harder to implement are:

+ Attract new younger members by helping them with restoration projects,

+ Seminars on painting, engine rebuilding, plating, glass installation, etc,
