#### Our First Antique Car (Part 1)

When Janet and I started dating some of my UTC friends and colleagues sensed this relationship was going to become permanent. One of them, Vern Eklund, to encourage the relationship, invited us to join him and wife Phyllis on a Model A day tour. We went, we had a great time and we were conquered. We joined the Western Massachusetts MARC Chapter and started touring with them modern.

Now we needed a Model A. I had my heart set on a 1930 or 31 Deluxe Phaeton but soon found they were far and few between. However, on one tour we met Eddie Crafts, a recent widower who was down in his cups that day. Janet as a former widow spent time with him and they commiserated. He in fact asked me if she could ride with him on that day's afternoon tour. Eddie, a dealer in NOS parts had a lovely 1930 standard roadster Kewaunee Green and Elk point Green with Apple Green wheels black top and upholstery and dual side mounts. He had supplied whatever parts were needed by Warren Paul of North Hampton MA to restore the car. Warren was known for building fine, correct, hi-point cars that were also great touring cars.

As time passed our friendship with Eddie grew. Eventually he decided to sell the car and despite having several very good offers gave us first right of refusal and an attractive price. We struck the deal and drove "Jezebel" home with much excitement.



Never having driven a Model A before I didn't know what expect in general and in particular from this car. So we started out cautiously and gingerly and increased the length and difficulty of the trips. Finally we went on a 3-night tour with the Western Mass A's through the Berkshire Mountains in western Mass. The car performed beautifully. I was very pleased. As we were almost home, about 2-miles to go, I said to Janet:"I think we have a very good car". She said: "You're not home yet, wait 'til we get in the driveway". Sometimes she's prescient!

At the next light I put in the clutch and nothing happenedshe kept right on rolling. I forced her out of gear and came to a stop. Got it into first gear, started the engine and drove home in first.

As I began to diagnose the problem I found the clutch released sometimes and sometimes not. Talking with my Model A buddies, I got lots of theories, none of which could account for the intermittency. I also got some very aggressive, almost violent ideas, on how to "break the clutch loose", permanently

I decided it's best to take the engine out and inspect the clutch to diagnose the problem. That would also give me a chance to easily check the main and rod bearings, the oil pan and the valves. So that became the plan.


