The Grand National Meet was held at the Auburn Auction Park in conjunction with an auction conducted by RM Auctions. In addition to the auction, tours were provided to the local museums. and a large flea market was held at the complex. RM reported that sales were over \$6.8 million including huge collections of automobilia as well as hundreds of cars. AACA members were offered free access to the auction as well as free bidder passes if one wished to participate in the auction. This auction lacked the hype we see on some of the televised affairs but it was still entertaining to watch the process. My observation was that there were some nice cars that sold at prices well below the money spent for restoration. Friday night brought entertainment from an excellent band.

On Saturday, in spite of a gloomy weather forecast, over 380 cars were registered to be on the show field where the judging took place. There were a few no-shows but they missed a nice day. An Indiana BBQ followed with over 700 people in the room. All went through the buffet lines in under 30 minutes! The awards presentation followed and the rain held off until after the ceremonies.

In 2002, Sue and I bought our first Model A, a 1929 black tudor. This was not our first antique car, since I have owned a T Model Ford since I was 15. We acquired the Model A from a man in Tenth Legion who had started to restore the car but decided he wanted to go a different route. So, he sold the car to us. This car supposedly came from West Virginia. We did a little work to the car in 2002 but we drove it. In 2004 thru 2006, we rebuilt the car from the front bumper to the rear luggage rack. By doing this work our goal was to build a solid touring car. From 2002 to 2019, we have driven this car approximately 45,000 miles. We have been on 17 national tours and numerous local tours with this car.




