Russell Museum and Swannanoa

Sam Spicher and Greg Riddle of Tri-County Region invited the W-S Region to join them in a private tour of the Russell Museum in Waynesboro, followed by a tour of the Gilded Age Mansion—Swannanoa.

The museum features all of the art that was displayed at the mansion during Walter and Lao Russell's ownership. (1948-1988)



Our group was given a private tour of the museum with a knowledgeable docent.



Among the sculptures featured were Franklin Roosevelt and Mark Twain.



Lao Russell was an accomplished painter and some of her work is on display in the museum.

Swannanoa is an Italian Renaissance Revival villa built in 1912 by millionaire and philanthropist James H. Dooley (1841 –1922) above Rockfish Gap on the border of northern Nelson County and Augusta County, Virginia and sits high atop the Blue Ridge Mountains at Afton. *(WikipediA)*



This Tiffany 4000 piece stained glass window is the highlight of the mansion and depicts Mrs.Sarah Dooley in the garden. It's the largest Tiffany window in a private residence.

Each of the major rooms is equipped with an ornate marble fireplace. They are only decorative since this was a "summer cottage".





A major use for the mansion today is as a wedding venue. The columns are decorated for a previous wedding.

Intended to be a "summer place" for Richmond, Virginia millionaire and philanthropist James H. Dooley and his wife Sarah "Sallie" O. May, it reportedly took over 300 artisans several years to build the structure, complete with marble from Tate, GA and inside Italian Marble, Georgian marble, Tiffany windows, and terraced gardens. It was built as a token of love from husband to wife, the depth of James and Sallie May's relationship being represented in the 4,000 piece Tiffany stained-glass window and a domed ceiling bearing the likeness of Mrs. Dooley Despite the lavish expenditure, it was occupied only for a few years following completion in 1912.

Major Dooley died in 1922 at the age of 82. He left Swannanoa entirely to his wife, Sallie Mae, along with several million dollars. Sallie May Dooley died in 1925 at the age of 79. Major Dooley left the estate to his four sisters. Many pieces of the Swannanoa furniture were moved to Maymont upon the death of Sallie May. Her Swan furniture and bed are on display at Maymont in Richmond, Virginia.


