BETSY—THE LONG-TERM RESTORATION

Part 2 <u>Where do I start?</u>

Everything I had read about restoration cautioned that documentation and pictures were essential to doing a quality job. As engineers, we were required to keep a detailed log of our activities so I started one on the '34, not recognizing that the log book would span many years of work on the car. Photos taken in the late 70's were 35 mm. slides and one had to wait for them to be developed before you knew if the picture showed that feature you were trying to capture.

In retrospect, I should have taken many more pictures of the car in its as-found state. It is hard to believe how difficult it is to find an original or authentically restored car like the one you are working on when you need to see how something goes together, particularly when you attempt to assemble it many years after you took it apart. I was able to collect a shop manual, a reprint of the Fisher Body manual, parts book and several sales brochures that helped me envision what the car should look like once it was restored.

Chevrolet built nearly 164,000 Master 2-Dr. Coaches in 1934 so it would seem that there should be lots of them around. In 30+ years at Hershey, I've never seen one. At the VCCA National Meet in 2011 there were twelve '34 Chevys there but no 2-Dr. coaches. I've seen pictures of several 2-Drs. that were built into street rods so maybe that's what happened to most of them that survived. If you are not familiar with early Chevrolets, you might not be aware that most of the framing for the body was wood. The tops of the cars were a heavy fabric supported by wood slats and chicken wire. The fabric would deteriorate over time (unless resealed) and the water leaks that developed would eventually rot the wooden frame. I suspect that many of the Chevies of this vintage were scrapped once the doors began to sag and became difficult to close. Scrap drives that occurred in support of WW II took their toll on many used (or used up) cars.

To be continued—Next we'll start tearing things apart to assess what will be required in the restoration.


