MEMBER SPOTLIGHT – JACK DRAGO



Editors Note: Jack is our newly elected Vice President and he was kind enough to give me his story.

I was born in Dorchester, Mass (a suburb of Boston) in 1940. My future wife Karen, was born about ½ mile away. And while we both attended the same church at different times together, and never went to the same schools at the same time together, we also never met each other until a chance meeting at a Corvette show on Cape Cod, Mass in 1981.

Fast forward from 1940 to June, 1958 when I graduated Hyde Park High School and 2 weeks later enlisted in the United States Navy SeaBees. I had just purchased my dream car, a 1956 Ford Victoria hardtop, which I then had to place in storage as I was going to spend the next year in the hot, sunny, cactus, scorpion and iguana infected plot of land called: "U.S. Naval Base, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba". The next time you're on vacation, you really should stop by and visit. You'll be glad to go home.

Work days in Gitmo consisted of building Officers Quarters and also writing the battalion newspaper as editor in chief. Many evenings (wee hours of the AM) were spent in the hills surrounding the base guarding against infiltrators. After a tour overseas, my enlistment was up and it was time to enter the civilian workforce.

For the next 8 years I was a Technician/Service Manager for 3 local (Mass) Chevy and Chrysler dealerships running the high performance and race car shops. During that time, a group of 4 of us built our first personal drag car, an Austin Healy with a 327 Chevy engine and 4 speed transmission. Several race cars later and in late 1970 it was time to hang up the tools and settle into corporate life.

The next 25 years were spent traveling the United States doing auditing, vehicle accident reconstruction and developing automobile dealerships. On Dec 31, 1994 while living in Syracuse, NY, I retired from corporate life (2 very short months long). I was then hired for the next 12 years by a Michigan based engineering firm to do audits, and also to train dealership technicians in specialized power train diagnostics and repairs. Some of the manufacturers included GM, Chrysler, Jaguar, Volvo, Land Rover, Nissan, International and Mack/Volvo trucks and Mitsubishi. During that period of time, my work area covered New York and 5 of the New England states (excluding Rhode Island) so we moved from the high tax state of New York to the cold, snowy, bug infested state of New Hampshire. Five short years of ludicrous property

taxes in NH gave us the opportunity to move yet once again. It was a tossup between Montana (me) and the Shenandoah Valley (Karen). Not wanting to spend the rest of eternity living alone in a cave, it was decided it would be in my best interest if I joined in the move to Virginia in 2002. While the moving truck was on route to deliver our furnishings, Thanksgiving was spent sitting on milk crates and eating turkey dinner on a card table. Work continued with travels now including VA, WV, MD, KY, and TN and of all places, Long Island, NY. Full retirement occurred in 2007.

Hobbies include not only collecting model cars, but our 2 muscle cars, a 1970 Plymouth AAR 'Cuda that is an HPOF vehicle, and also a 2010 Dodge Hemi Challenger. The latest addition (on Dec. 18, 2010) to our fleet is a Peacock Blue1956 Ford Victoria. The Ford will be driven to most if not all of our meets. The majority of my time is spent trap and clay pigeon shooting. Now to fill in the only time left in which to sleep (3 -4 AM) I've been elected to be your Vice President. I wish to thank the members for electing me and I hope to be able to fill some very large shoes (not physical) left by our former VP, Bob Ridle.


