"WE WILL NEVER FORGET"

As we entered the Staunton Fire Station for our tour on Feb. 17, we passed the memorial honoring the 2,752 victims of the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center on Sept. 11, 2001. This memorial features a piece of structural steel recovered from that site. The plaque at the upper left lists the names of 403 firefighters and police officers who died that day in the heroic rescue efforts.

EDITORIAL

Ethanol Fuel—What's in Your Tank?

Jack Drago is working on a program for a future Region meeting on ethanol fuel. If you have had experience with adverse effects of this fuel on your collector car, we would love to hear from you.

In the mean time, I urge all of you to purchase your ethanol-free fuel from the few gas stations around that still have it available. For example, the Royal station on Churchville Ave. in Staunton sells non-ethanol regular for \$.10/ gallon more than their E-10 regular with ethanol. Since we normally expect at least a 5% loss in fuel economy with 10% ethanol, paying \$.10 more for a gallon of gas saves you money. Besides that fact, we encourage these stations to keep supplying ethanol free fuel that is essential for our collector cars. I run the non-ethanol regular in my modern cars as well as the antiques because it makes economic sense and it avoids the problems inherent with this blend.

News reports state that the government push for E-15 (15% ethanol) has resulted in several auto makers warning owners that their warranty will be voided if it is used in their vehicles. Owners beware!

Do you have Sunday, March 17, 1:30 p.m., on your calendar for our next meeting at the Wood Grill in Harrisonburg? See you there.

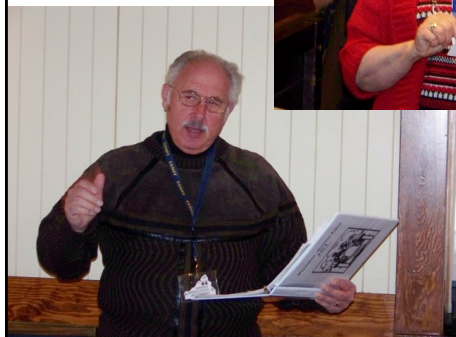

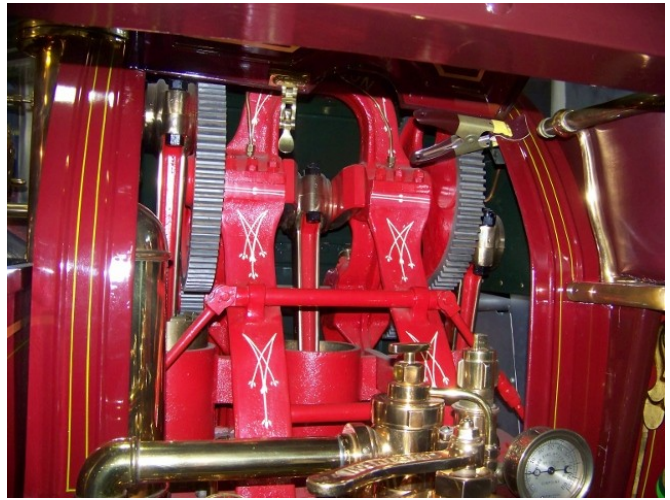

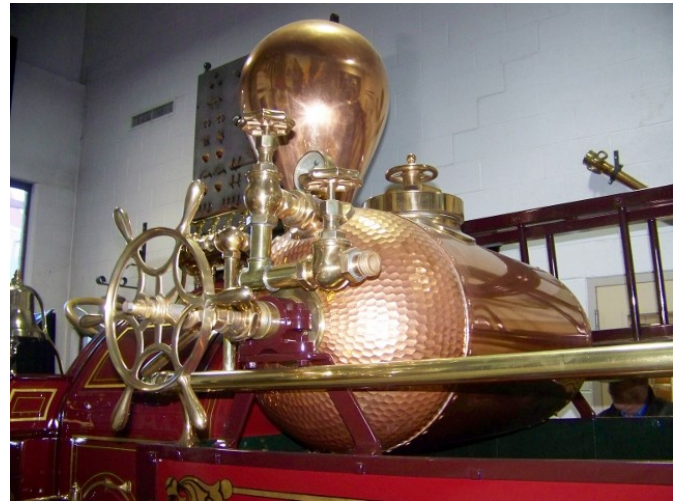

W-S Region Tours “Jumbo”

Following our dinner meeting at Red Lobster we were treated to a visit to the Staunton Fire department on Augusta Street where we toured their museum, home of Jumbo, the 1911 Robinson Chemical Fire Engine.



Jumbo carries a 3 piston positive displacement pump that delivered 750 gallons per minute.



A 40 gallon chemical tank is onboard and the large brass balloon shaped dome is an accumulator tank to absorb shock when the hoses are turned on or off.

Jumbo was the first motorized truck of its kind to be used in the state of Virginia. It was delivered in March 1912 and cost \$8500. It remained in working order until 1971 when the motor quit for the third time. It was restored by White Post Restorations from 1979-1984 and placed on exhibit at the Staunton Fire Department. It is one of only two remaining 1911 Robinson fire engines in the world.



Jumbo is powered by a 6 cylinder gasoline engine, built by Buffalo Marine, with a displacement of 1245 cubic inches that produced 150 horsepower. The cylinders are cast in pairs. These engines were used in early tugboats.

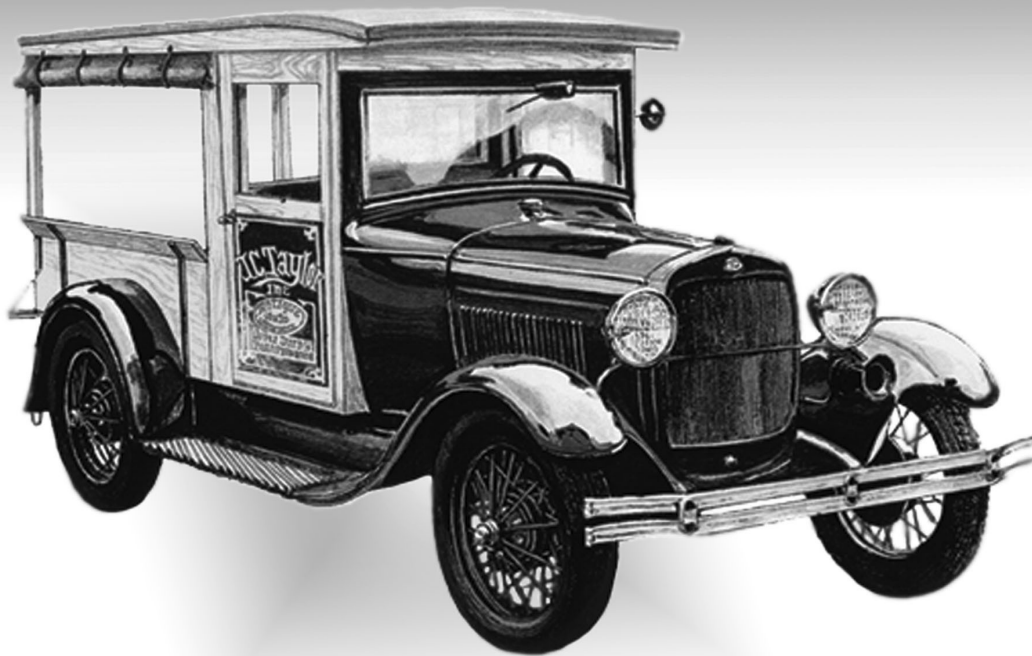
