
August is Augusta County Fair time and we held our indoor car display tha was well-received by fairgoers.

For the November Show & Tell Billy Melton brought an interesting articulated grease gun fitting.






We'll collect money for our tickets at our meeting on January 21. Let's see if we can fill up a pair of tables.


