2021 Founders Tour—Canaan Valley West Virginia

Region members Ken & Shirley Farley, Nelson Driver, Jim Gregory, Alfred Meyer and your editor attended the 2021 Founders Tour in the Canaan Valley of West Virginia. The Founders Tour is for cars from 1932 through 1996. The tour was held May 20 to 25 and we came home on May 26. There were 94 cars and about 200 people in attendance. The Tour Director was Franklin Gage and he was a one-man show and did a great job. The weather was warm and nice and we all got to experience some hilly, curvy roads through a beautiful part of WV.

The opening "Welcome Dinner was held at the Davis Fire Hall and the catered buffet was very good. Tourists who had been cooped up for a year got a chance to see friends and swap stories.

On Friday we toured to **Spruce Knob**, the highest point in West Virginia (4863 ft.) The road to the Knob is 12 miles long and paved but extremely narrow and when we met another vehicle it got exciting. After a short hike we climbed the observation deck to enjoy the view.

Lunch stop was the Gateway Restaurant. Did I mention that we ate very well on this tour? Several members reported weight gain before returning home.



In the afternoon we visited **Seneca Rocks** that tower 900 feet over the North Fork River. This area was used to train rock climbing troops during WWII and is enjoyed by climbers today.

On Saturday we travelled to **Elkins WV** where we visited the Railroad and Appalachian Museum.

Sunday was our tour to the **Cass Railroad** where we took the train ride to Bald Knob. The Durbin Greenbrier Valley Railroad provided a 4.5 hour trip with lunch using their Shay locomotives that were specially designed for steep terrain.

On Monday we toured to the **Smoke Hole Caverns** where we enjoyed a cool hike into the caves. The caverns were named since Seneca Indians once used the caverns to smoke game they had captured. Smoke escaped through a hole in top of the caves and thus the name.

The caverns were used as shelter for Civil War soldiers as well as moonshiners during prohibition.

In the afternoon we visited the **Reeds Creek Fish Hatchery** where they specialize in Golden Trout.



On Tuesday, the final day of the tour, we travelled to **Blackwater Falls State Park** to enjoy one of the most photographed sites in West Virginia. The falls get their name from the dark water caused by tannic acid from fallen hemlock and red spruce needles.



That afternoon we visited **Grant County Mulch Plant** near Moorefield, WV. We watched processing, packing and shipping of mulch and firewood. The owner explained that they supply much of the mulch for the East coast from their 6 factories



The tour concluded with another great meal at the Davis Fire Hall. It was good to be touring again after the lockdown last year. We drove 906 miles for the week.

The **American Truck Historical Society** (ATHS)

held their annual National Convention at the Rockingham County Fairgrounds on June 3-5, 2021. There were close to 1000 trucks on display, both antiques as well as modern rigs. Your editor naturally focused on the older models and saw brands I had never heard of. These trucks came from all over the country and put on an impressive show.


Jack reminded everyone of our Baldwin Park Display on July 10 and our Ice Cream Social at Stuarts Draft Retirement Community on July 16.

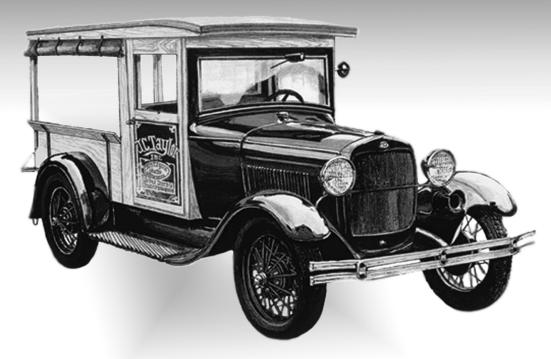
