## RAMBLINGS FROM THE PRESIDENT



Your editor did a presentation on Electric Vehicles adapted from a presentation by Dean Tryon in N.C.



EV's started in the 1890's but were pretty much gone by 1930 as gasoline vehicles took over

We talked about GM's EV-1 that started the modern EV era.



#### On the Road

- Tesla can get a charge for 300 miles in just over 1 hour
- Typical gasoline car can add fuel for 300 miles in 10 minutes
- We would need 6 charging outlets for every gas pump to service the same number of cars
- There are 1,200,000 gas pumps in the USA

We discussed the challenges of infrastructure supporting long distance travel of EV's vs. gasoline powered vehicles.

Stu Allen present a very interesting program on electric cars. He explained the pros and cons of the electric cars both past and present.




